

Fielded well throughout the year with his strong arm and confident wicketkeeping. As a batsman Ollie had some fine knocks, always trying his best to hit runs and put pressure on the field.
Ashton Freeman	Ash enjoyed a solid season; a new pair of shoes mid-way seemed to help with rhythm, and he delivered a strong second half with some fine performances in the last few games.
