As luck would have it Camden 1st Grade won their 10th straight Premiership, a wonderful achievement by all who have contributed to these 10 victories. Congratulations and well done! Thank you to all the Club Captains for your involvement and taking the leadership of your teams and to all the players including a lot of Juniors who contributed and filled the squads. Congratulations also to those players who participated in the inaugural CDCA T20 competition where we fielded a Division 1 and Division 2 team. It was a great thrill to see our Division 1 team take out

the final, so well done to all players. Our Division 2 team also made it to the final but went down in a spirited effort.

I'm pleased to say that our 6th grade Father and Son team led by club sponsor Simon White had a successful season.
