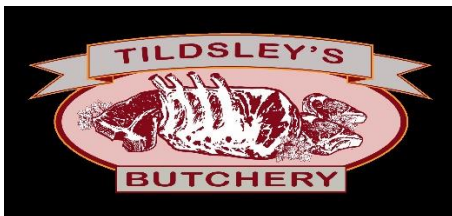

## The Presidents Report

Dear Club Members, once again Camden Cricket Club (est 1843) has performed extremely well both on and off the field for season 2017/18.

Cricket is a sport that is played by people with differing abilities, different nationalities and backgrounds, where lifelong friends and memories are made and where certain values and a team atmosphere and harmony are truly formed.

The club was awarded the Cricket Australia Community Cricket Club of the Year Award last year at the Cricket Australia "A Sport For All" Community Cricket Awards. The award was announced at an Awards Dinner at the MCG on Wednesday night 26<sup>th</sup> April. As a club we are thrilled to have been chosen as winner of this award and feel that this is a positive reflection of the commitment and efforts of many volunteers over many years. It is also vindication of the programs and procedures that we have continued to pursue this past season as we seek to continue to develop and promote the game of cricket to our junior players.

Our club fielded 17 junior teams, 1 Thunder Girls League Team and 8 senior teams this season. Thank you to all the club sponsors, and team sponsors, for once again showing support to the club. Without your valuable contributions we would not be able to continually improve and develop the skills of our players and the enjoyment they derive from playing the game.

We successfully ran the Milo In2Cricket program with 32 participants which is the starting point for our younger generation to learn and enjoy the basic skills of the game. Also, in conjunction with Cricket NSW we helped arrange the T20 Blast program with 34 participants which is an essential stepping stone to red ball games. Thank you, Clair Hardy, for your valuable time and effort in running and coordinating these programs and a special thank you to David O'Brien, Ashlee Dodd, Jamie Warwick and Sarah Howard for your valuable input as well.

Camden Cricket Club has shown a firm commitment to inclusion. One of our club committee members and women's cricket Ambassador, Clair Hardy, has taken an active role in the development of girl's participation in cricket. Clair has been a key liaison person between our club, the CDCA and Cricket NSW in growing girls cricket and has been part of the Thunder Girls Cricket League working group. Eleven girls were registered and playing in our mixed junior teams this season. We were one of five clubs who entered a team in the inaugural Thunder Girls Cricket League held on Tuesday evenings, with 10 girls participating. Furthermore, all players wishing to register are accepted irrespective of their ability level and placed into a team and grade commensurate with their ability. Coaching that is provided has ensured that all players derive the fullest possible enjoyment from their cricket experience.

Development of player skills through coaching programs is also a key focus of our Club. All junior coaches require level 1 certification. This year we have again run specialised coaching clinics open to all players focussing on aspects such as wicket-keeping, front foot play, bowling techniques and the like. Our active coaching programs aim to develop the skills of all players. In late January we held a coaching clinic run by four current Campbelltown Ghosts first grade players which was open to all our players and was enthusiastically received by all who attended.

This season Cricket Australia introduced Stage 1 of revised formats for junior cricket which were adopted in the U/10's competition. Feedback from coaches, managers and parents regarding equal participation and involvement has been very positive and well received. Some of the changes included shortened pitch length, reduced number of players in each team, equal number of balls faced when batting and number of overs bowled.

Due to the junior playing numbers of our club in each age group, and late communication and changes to age groups and divisions by the CDCA, we decided to arrange for each team in a particular age groups train with and alongside each other this season, to keep harmony amongst our teams and to build skills together. Thanks Graham Hardy for your involvement in coordinating coaching this year.

Our club has continued to maintain its strong links with Cricket NSW and the Sydney Thunder franchise. As part of our Thunder Club Alliance, Camden Cricket Club again hosted a Thunder Clinic at Onslow Oval on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2018 which was attended by over 250 cricketers from throughout the CDCA district.

To all our Coaches, Managers, Scorers and Volunteers for our 17 Junior teams I'd like to pass on a very big thank you for not only taking a role to help the club, but offering skills, mentoring and valuable time to arrange team practise and coordinating players and umpiring on game day. It is a very large commitment but I sure we all find it very rewarding to see the extent to which players improve from the start of the season to the end.

A successful club should not be measured by premierships. Trying to balance the talent across all teams has been a learning process for us as a club but well done to each team and coach for their fine efforts during the season.

Seventeen junior teams were registered in the CDCA competitions this past season, an increase of one team on the previous season. We also registered our first all-girls team in the Under 10 White competition and they were successful in winning their premierships undefeated. In total 18 girls registered to play in Saturday aged competitions. Fourteen teams reached the semi-finals, nine teams reached the finals and five teams won their premierships in a variety of ages and divisions. Much of the strength of our playing numbers is due to the commitment our club has made to the Milo In2Cricket program over several years. This overall performance is also testimony to the dedication and commitment of players, coaching staff and all club officials.

In seniors we fielded 8 Teams, 1<sup>st</sup> Grade, 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade, 4<sup>th</sup> Grade, 7<sup>th</sup> Grade, 8<sup>th</sup> Grade, two in 9<sup>th</sup> Grade and a father son team in the Div 2 one day competition. We hope you all had an enjoyable season, congratulations to Captains Glen Tipping and Greg Pinnington and their father son team on winning the Div 2/one day competition and to our Club Captain Ken McNeill and his mighty 8<sup>th</sup> grade on taking the title in a nail biting last over victory. Thank you to all the Senior Captains for your involvement and taking the leadership of your teams and to all the players including a lot of Juniors who contributed and filled the squads.

In an attempt to overcome the lack of playing fields in our Local Government Area, the club has continued to work with Camden Council in the development of the Ferguson Land. Additional funds have been directed to the project by Camden Council in addition to the more than \$3m already allocated to develop additional playing fields as well as a Cricket NSW Centre of Excellence. Once again thanks to Chris Patterson our state MP, Camden Council and Cricket NSW who are all driving this project to hopefully commence later this year.

We have also been arranging Club social events and thank you to Michelle Warwick for all her work coordinating the Season Launch Golf Day, the Christmas Party at Camden Rugby club "Wow what a venue"! Rams v Lambs at Kirkham and semi and finals presentations back at the CVI.

Finally, I would like to personally acknowledge and thank our current committee for all their efforts and support through the 2017/18 cricket season, all of whom have been busy behind the scenes. Without their knowledge, commitment and energy the club wouldn't be what it is today.

Ryan	Baker	The quiet achiever and from proven cricket stock. Ryan finished the season bowling leg spin with great affect to complement his attacking batting. He was third on the list of wicket takers and may well find himself at the top of this list next season bowling his un-playables! I can see Ryan being a middle order batsmen who will demoralise tired attacks late in the day. He has a good eye and does not like blocking the ball.
Mitchell	Clark	Our Camden DCA representative, Mitch had a big year for the team. Again, from a proven cricketing family, Mitch is our most technically correct player and our go to person in the pressure situations. He topped the batting aggregate facing tough overs at the end of a match and opened the bowling on plenty of occasions. Mitch completed his first hatrick in our first game to set up a great year. Mitch will be in amongst the action in most games and his performance will go a long way in determining outcomes of junior games.
Giles	Consunji	Giles is again one of our most technically correct batsmen and spent much of the year in the top three against the new ball bowlers. He was only dismissed 4 times throughout the season, the lowest of all the team. His left arm swingers were very effective also claiming 20 wickets. Giles remained positive all season and had a smile on his face even if things were not going our way. Even at this early age he shows a true love of the game.
Joshua	Davison	A late comer to the team and Josh's first year of cricket did not deter him giving 100% from his first game. A big improver throughout the season, Josh become one of our mainstay wicketkeepers. His batting improved with every innings and was willing to listen to advice and implement new techniques to great effect.
James	Ford	A real thinker of the game, James had a big year. He topped the wicket aggregate and averages which included a double hatrick against our Camden Blue team, a feat I have not witnessed in 35 years around a cricket field. He has a great set of hands taking 7 catches through the year. His all-rounder ability gave him the most points in this category. Showing his leadership skills throughout the season, I chose James to captain our team in the semi-final. At the end of the match opposition parents and their coach complemented me on the way Camden approached and played the game.
Lewis	Giltrow	Lewie stood up with the bat in our semi-final facing Tahmoor's best bowlers and a huge turnaround from the week before. He did the same when we beat Tahmoor during the year. His off-speed swingers proved difficult to hit and he improved steadily throughout the year taking 11 wickets. Always keen to learn, we need to continue to work with on his batting technique and fielding and he will enjoy the game even more.
Matthew	Patterson	Matt showed he has enough talent to be playing with the rep team if he so desires. He opened the batting on most occasions this year and was only dismissed 5 times all year, twice being in the one match! His average of 43.4 is a great achievement at this age level. In his limited overs due to keeping duties, he still claimed 11 wickets at the second-best average of 6.7. Matt has the personality of a wicketkeeper, always chatting, encouraging the team and never afraid to ask the umpire whether there was a snick. Matt had a great year and was an important cog in our wheel.
Oscar	Saunders	Like all 9yo boys never one to listen to dad's advice too often! Oscar had a good year and really enjoyed the company of his teammates. He took 12 wickets with an average of 7.5 and on occasions bowled quite lively with the new ball.
